Prophecy: The Messiah is coming.

"This is what the Lord says -... I am the first and I am the last" ...

Isaiah 44:6, 48:12; Revelations 1:17.

Therefore the Lord Himself will give you a sign: the virgin will conceive and give birth to a son, and will call Him Immanuel.

Isaiah 7:14.

God the Son with us.

*In the beginning was the Word,
and the Word was with God,*

and the Word was God. He was with God in the beginning.

*Through Him all things were made; without Him nothing was made that has been made.
In Him was life and that life was the light of all mankind. ...The true light that gives light to
everyone was coming into the world.*

Yet to all who did receive Him, to those who believed in His name, He gave the right to become children of God – children born not of natural descent, nor of human decision or a husband's will, but born of God.

*The Word became flesh and made His dwelling among us. We have seen His glory, The glory of the one and only Son, Who came from the Father, full of grace and truth.

But after he had considered this, an angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream and said,

"Joseph son of David, do not be afraid to take Mary home as your wife, because what is conceived in her is from the Holy Spirit. She will give birth to a son, and you are to give Him the name of

Jesus, because He will save His people from their sins."

All this took place to fulfill what the Lord had said through the prophet: "the virgin will be with child and will give birth to a son, and they will call Him Immanuel" – which means,

"God with us."

(Jesus praying)

Note.

Trust Him - means to take His advice. Try - in a new way, the less worried way. Do things because He has saved you already. Not hoping to get into heaven as a reward for your actions, but wanting to act in a certain way because you trust Him.

From your Faith in Christ, good actions will come.

Hope in Him. Earthly pleasures were never meant to satisfy completely, but only to suggest the real thing. You were made for another world. So you want to be careful, on the one hand, to never be unthankful for your earthly blessings; and on the other hand, never to mistake them for only a kind of copy or echo. You must keep alive, in yourself,

the desire for your true country, which you will not find until after you pass on.

You certainly want to avoid getting snowed under or distracted; making it

your main object in life

to press on to that other country and to help others do the same![\[1\]](#)

Prophesy: Christ is coming again.

*And if I go and prepare a place for you,
I will come back and take you to be with Me that you also may be where I am.*

John 14:3.
